



March Tips - Delete Spool Files & Select Previous Command Utility

This month's tip was obtained from Search 400 and iSeriesNetwork

1. If you have a completed job that has a large number of spooled files and you entered the command to work with submitted jobs (WRKSBMJOB), you can enter option 4 to end the job even though the job is completed.

Press F4 to prompt and enter "yes" to delete spool files. This will delete all the spooled files without having to enter an option 8 to work with spooled file and individually deleting the spool file.

2. FREE UTILITY: SELECT PREVIOUSLY EXECUTED COMMANDS

Craig Rutledge's *Select Previously Executed Commands (CMDLOG)* utility addresses the problem of having to press F9 repeatedly on the command line to cycle back through previously executed commands. This utility pulls all the commands you have executed during your current session into a subfile and lets you run or prompt the commands. Simply key *CMDLOG* on the command line to execute.
